88	Friday, March 10, 2017	Last day for a local entity to deliver a resolution requesting election services and consolidation from the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors. <i>EC §§1405, 10002, 12001</i>
82	Thursday, March 16, 2017	The Elections Official will designate a measure letter at the Elections Office at 11 a.m. on this date. <i>EC §13116</i>
81	Friday, March 17, 2017	Primary arguments in favor of or against local measures are due by 12:00 p.m. Such arguments, if already submitted, may be changed until and including today. Impartial analysis due. <i>EC §§ 9281, 9282, 9283. Atherton City Council Resolution No. 17-02, 17-03, 17-04</i>
81	Friday, March 17, 2017	10-calendar day review period begins March 17, 2017 at 12:00 p.m. and ends March 27, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. for primary arguments filed in favor of or against measures and impartial analysis. Between these dates the Elections Official or any registered voter eligible to vote on the contest in question, may seek a writ of mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted. The request shall be filed no later than the end of the 10-calendar-day public examination period.

71	Monday, March 27, 2017	Rebuttal Arguments for measures where a primary argument was filed both in favor and against are due by 12:00 p.m. <i>EC §§9285. Atherton City Council Resolution No. 17-02, 17-03, 17-04</i>
71	Monday, March 27, 2017	10-calendar day review period begins on March 27, 2017 at 12:00 p.m. and ends April 6, 2017 at 5:00 p.m. for rebuttal arguments filed in favor and/or against measures. Between these dates the Elections Official or any registered voter, eligible to vote on the contest in question, may seek a writ of mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted if found to be misleading or inaccurate. The request shall be filed no later than the end of the 10-calendar-day public examination period.
61	Thursday, April 6, 2017	<i>EC §§9295. Atherton City Council Resolution No. 17-02, 17-03, 17-04</i>
60	Friday, April 7, 2017	Between these dates, any registered military or overseas voter may apply for a vote by mail ballot.
7	Tuesday, May 30, 2017	<i>EC §§ 3001</i>
45	Saturday, April 22, 2017	County Elections Official must send ballots and balloting material to all military and overseas voters who filed ballot applications by this date. <i>EC §§3105, 3114</i>
40	Thursday, April 27, 2017	1st Pre-election campaign and supplemental independent expenditure statements due. <i>GC §§84200.5(c), 84200.8(a), 84203.5</i>
29	Monday, May 8, 2017	Between these dates, Vote by Mail ballots & Voter Information Pamphlet will be sent to all registered voters. To ensure that the voter has enough time to return their ballot, the last day to request a replacement Vote by Mail ballot through the mail is May 30, 2017. Requests made after May 30, 2017 must be made in person at the Voting Center at 40 Tower Road, San Mateo.
7	Tuesday, May 30, 2017	<i>EC §§3001, 3023</i>
15	Monday, May 22, 2017	Voter registration closes on this date for the June 6, 2017 Special All Mail Ballot Election. Voters must register by this date to be eligible to vote in this election. Voter registration forms postmarked prior to or with this date are accepted. <i>EC §§2102, 2107</i>
14	Tuesday, May 23, 2017	From this date through Election Day, an individual can conditionally register to vote at 40 Tower Road, San Mateo. The individual must complete an affidavit of registration, and will be given a provisional ballot to vote. Once the county elections official confirms the individual's eligibility to register, and validates the individual's information, the registration becomes permanent and the provisional ballot will be counted. <i>EC §§2170-2173</i>
12	Thursday, May 25, 2017	Second pre-election campaign and supplemental independent expenditure statements due. <i>GC §§84200.5(c), 84200.8(b), 84203.5</i>
7	Tuesday, May 30, 2017	Last day to request a replacement Vote by Mail ballot through the mail. Requests made after May 30, 2017 must be made in person at the Voting Center at 40 Tower Road, San Mateo. <i>EC §§3001, 3023</i>
0	Tuesday, June 6, 2017	Election Day. Voting Center opens at 7 a.m. and closes at 8 p.m. Semifinal official canvass commences upon the closing of the polls, 8:00 p.m. At 8:05 p.m., San Mateo County issues first report and continues to issue reports until all precincts have reported. <i>EC §§1000-1003, 1100, 14212, 15150</i>
+3	Friday, June 9, 2017	Vote by Mail ballots postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the County Elections Official by this date shall be counted. <i>EC §§ 3020, 3117, 4103</i>
+30	Thursday, July 6, 2017	Last day for County Elections Official to certify election results to the jurisdictions participating in the election. <i>EC §15372</i>
