Argument Against Measure P (Foster City Bond)

- The City of Foster City realizes its levee needs \$90,000,000 to ECEIVED improvements to meet Federal, FEMA, standards. With interest, the City estimates the taxpayers will pay a total of \$155,122,284.
- $\ensuremath{\eta}$ These bonds must be repaid by Ad Valorem property taxes. In $\ensuremath{\eta}$ California, the Ad Valorem taxes are very unequal. Some families must $\ensuremath{\eta}$ pay many times what neighbors pay, for the very same floor plan. The tax collector does not care.
- Foster City does face problems from a once—in—100—year flood, but is that even the most urgent danger? With the San Andreas fault running straight through the Peninsula, and with Foster City built on vulnerable fill land, concern for the inevitable earthquake seems more gurgent than the slow rise in sea level.
- The levee protects about 8,000 properties in SantMateo as well as the 109,000 in Foster City, according to the Daily Journal. Why don't the 12 people in San Mateo who are also protected by this levee, pay their 13 share of the \$155,122,284? And why don't they get a vote on this 1 important issue?
- (\Slowly rising sea level would surely affect the entire Bay Area. This is a regional problem, with regional benefits and costs. In fact, Alameda County expressed concern that Foster City's levee work could negatively impact its communities. Why does Foster City have to do this all alone?
