## Measure \_\_:

Advisory Vote Only: Should the City draft and adopt an ordinance to allow and regulate retail sales of cannabis and cannabis products at up to two locations within the City?

## **Primary Argument in Favor:**

According to the City of HMB, 69% of voters favored Proposition 64, which legalized 2 a regulated cannabis industry statewide two years ago. These cannabis ballot 23 measures are a continuation of the process to implement a local, regulated cannabis 34 industry in alignment with the mandate of our voters from 2016.

The Coastside Cannabis Coalition supports this advisory measure to draft and adopt 59 an ordinance to allow and locally regulate retail sales of cannabis and cannabis products at up to two locations within the city. We support two dispensaries as a 87 comfortable starting point for our local community, and would eventually like to see the local market and patient demand determine the number of retail locations.

Cannabis delivery services already serve more than 1000 patients on the coast from Pacifica to Pescadero. Allowing brick and mortar dispensaries in HMB would lincrease patient access to safe, reliable, and regulated cannabis products that are 148 free from pesticides and other contaminants, while also keeping those revenues, 159 jobs, and taxes local. Senior and adult medical patients suffering from chronic pain 142 and other health conditions would have easier access to safe, regulated cannabis 184 products so they can take advantage of the well-known therapeutic benefits.

These delivery services currently operate outside of any local regulatory or taxation 208 structures. Passing this measure would support patient access while also 218 implementing and supporting local control of the cannabis retail activities already 229 taking place in our town. 234

Furthermore, peer reviewed research published in the Journal of the American 245 Medical Association shows that access to state-regulated medical cannabis 255 programs reduce opioid overdose deaths by 25% (Bachhuber et al, 2014) and 2427 significantly reduce the number of opioid prescriptions written, particularly for 277 seniors (Bradford et al, 2018).
