## Ballot Measure Rebuttal Argument Submission Form

If both an argument in favor of <u>and</u> against a measure have been selected for publication in the voter information pamphlet, a rebuttal to the argument in favor of or the argument against the measure may be submitted as outlined in this form.

The author of the argument in favor of the measure may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument to the argument against the measure or may authorize in writing any other person or persons to prepare, submit, or sign the rebuttal argument. Likewise, the author of the argument against the measure may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument to the argument in favor of the measure or may authorize in writing any other person or persons to prepare, submit, or sign the rebuttal argument.

A rebuttal argument shall not be accepted unless accompanied by this completed form, which shall contain the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the person(s) submitting it or, if submitted on behalf of a bona fide association of citizens/organization, the name of the association/organization and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers.

## REBUTTAL TO ARGUMENT AGAINST MEASURE TT

While hotel guests may not have the right to vote on Measures in cities in which they do not live, they do add to the cost of maintaining the City and its infrastructure. Transit Occupancy Taxes (TOT) are common throughout California and elsewhere and are a means of ensuring that hotel guests pay their share of the City resources that they use. The argument against presumes that the residential taxpayer should bear that burden alone. This measure only equalizes the sharing of that cost among those who create the need to bear it.

Foster City has historically had the lowest TOT in San Mateo County and these increases will to not change that. Hotel guests, like residents, are able to enjoy the features of Foster City, its parks and its streets. They are protected from harm by our police and fire fighters. They use our water and wastewater. They create trash and recycling that we must collect and dispose of. Asking them to pay a small amount for this service is not only common, it is fair and reasonable. Currently our residents bear the burden of stress to our infrastructure and quality of life. This small increase will ensure that the burden is shared with the visitors who enjoy our City. We are asking them to pay their fair share.
