We supported the voter approved Measure D 2000 and Measure M 2006 bonds to build new and/or remodeled buildings/classrooms on the district's six high school campuses, the continuation high school, and the San Mateo Performing Arts Center.

At the completion of Measure M, each of the six comprehensive high schools will have new and/or remodeled, seismically safe, modern buildings, classrooms, labs, new or expanded libraries, gyms, theaters, cafeterias, be accessibility and safety compliant, energy efficient and have security systems. Some will have new fields and landscaping.

So, what is Measure O for?

- There are no "urgent and critical" needs that justify an \$186,000,000 bond.
- Unlike the previous bonds, the project list fails to state where improvements would be made.

Measure O is about:

- · Buying land and building a new continuation high school
- · Updating district administrative facilities
- · Giving the district a blank check

What's wrong with this picture?

The district already has property (Crestmoor site) on which sits a model continuation high school, but it wants to sell that as well as sell property on the Hillsdale campus. Further, Measure M dollars were designated to improve the Crestmoor site – where have those dollars gone?
