

## **Ballot Measure Argument Rebuttal Submission Form**

If both an argument in favor of <u>and</u> against a measure have been selected for publication in the voter information pamphlet, a rebuttal to the argument in favor of or the argument against the measure may be submitted as outlined in this form.

The author of the argument in favor of the measure may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument to the argument against the measure or may authorize in writing any other person or persons to prepare, submit, or sign the rebuttal argument. Likewise, the author of the argument against the measure may prepare and submit a rebuttal argument to the argument in favor of the measure or may authorize in writing any other person or persons to prepare, submit, or sign the rebuttal argument.

A rebuttal argument shall not be accepted unless accompanied by this completed form, which shall contain the printed name(s) and signature(s) of the person(s) submitting it or, if submitted on behalf of a bona fide association of citizens/organization, the name of the association/organization and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers.

Word count limit for Rebuttal Arguments = 250 The rebuttal arguments shall be submitted to the elections official conducting the election no later than August 25, 2014 These rules apply to all rebuttal arguments unless a rebuttal argument is otherwise provided by law. ## Rebuttal Argument to Measure K

Protecting our educational programs, retaining qualified teachers and preserving small class sizes are critical to a quality education for our children. Don't be misled by the argument against Measure K. It wasn't written by a District resident who shares our local interests. Clearly we know what is best for our community. Here are the real facts:

Fact: Measure K will renew the parcel tax that District property owners have already been paying since 2008.

Fact: Property owners in 14 out of 19 San Mateo County school districts are currently paying for the parcel tax measures. The average annual tax rate is approximately \$170 per parcel; much higher than the \$102.94 Bayshore Elementary School District is requesting. If we are to be competitive, we need Measure K.

Fact: Funds from Measure K will ensure that teachers are well trained and using the most effective 13 techniques for teaching as well as integrating improved technology. Without Measure K, the educational experience provided to our children will suffer.

Fact: The Bayshore Elementary School District had an increase of 50 API points from 2008 – 2013.

Fact: Reduced enrollment means less funding from the State, thus an even greater need for Measure K.

Measure K will improve the quality of education to local children by protecting our reading, math, science, and music programs, and increases student access to technology and instructional materials.
