ARGUMENT IN FAVOR OF MEASURE V

The "Menlo Park Neighborhood Protection and General Plan Consistency Initiative" gives **VOTERS** the power to **PRESERVE AND PROTECT RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOODS** in Menlo Park. Our family-friendly residential neighborhoods are the reason many choose to live here. Yet a majority of City Council has supported **projects driven by for-profit developers**, ignoring residents' pragmatic concerns of excessive traffic, overcrowding, and less use of roads for walking and biking.

With Menlo Park's recent switch to district elections, you only vote for one of five representatives. That means three City Councilmembers—who do not live in your neighborhood and lack accountability to you—can change zoning to allow development that permanently erodes YOUR neighborhood without your say. YOU DESERVE A VOICE!

Vote YES for the power to oppose zoning changes that unleash intense development in low-density neighborhoods. A YES vote protects existing zoning established by Menlo Park's General Plan unless the majority of Menlo Park citizens want it changed.

LET MENLO PARK RESIDENTS DECIDE - NOT POLITICIANS!

Measure V DOES NOT BLOCK development, including affordable housing. It merely requires a VOTE OF THE PEOPLE to change zoning in single-family residential neighborhoods. Not a single parcel zoned for commercial, industrial, or mid-density residential purposes is affected by this initiative.

Voting YES on Measure V:

- Ensures VOTERS HAVE THE FINAL SAY on unpopular zoning decisions by City Council.
- Guarantees no City Council, now or in the future, can take your right to vote on zoning changes that permit developers to damage single-family residential neighborhoods.
- Sends a message to developers that, to earn approval, they must engage Menlo Park
 voters and bring only projects that enhance our community and are consistent with our
 General Plan.
- Removes undue pressures on City Council from developers and special interest groups to irresponsibly develop in our community.

Vote YES on V to protect and preserve residential neighborhoods from overdevelopment.
