La Honda & Pescadero schools are essential spaces for our community. 11 As our community evacuation site, our middle and high schools offer shelter and safety 118 in times of need. During COVID, our high school campus offered direct access to testing and vaccine > 20 services, otherwise only accessible from distant locations. Our two elementary schools provide community meeting and event space. 10 A haven for sports & play, our campuses provide community access to little league & > 22 soccer fields, open gyms, and tennis courts. Our high school is the primary polling location in our rural area. 12 Quality schools raise property values, community interest, and community pride. 10 Since 2006, we've rebuilt our La Honda Elementary school campus, relocated our district 10 kitchen and district office, repaired and replaced leaking roofs, modernized our early learning 13 building, and established outdoor classrooms. 5 There is more work to do... 6 13 In August, 2022 the district allocated funding for a facilities assessment and requested proposals from reputable school development firms. The outcome of this assessment, available 12 for review at http://www.lhpusd.com/bond, outlined critical updates and modernization recommendations at all three campuses. In September 2022, the citizen oversight committee formed to advise project priorities, give voice to community members, and enhance project transparency and accountability. Today, A YES vote means our school district would issue general obligation bonds up to >24 \$15,000,000 dollars to respond to the assessment outlined above. When our students visit other schools, they stare in wonder and ask,"When will it be our turn?" They deserve more and you can give that to them. Your support can create an environment where we enter our school doors, enjoy our athletic fields, and feel safe during evacuations at campuses reflecting the pride and care that makes our community unique.
