Shall the City of Brisbane's measure to fund city services/facilities, such as neighborhood police patrols, fire prevention services, urban wildfire protection, crime suppression/investigation, pothole/street repair, parks and other city facilities, and to support other city services, by levying a ½¢ sales tax, generating approximately \$2,000,000 annually until ended by voters, be adopted?

Arguments for or against the above measures may be submitted in writing to the City Clerk's Office, 50 Park Place, Brisbane, California, for printing and distribution to the voters, pursuant to provisions of the California Elections Code, on or before12:00 p.m. on August 19, 2022. Argument Against City of Brisbane Sales Tax Increase: Measure U

With this new, city-level tax scheme — at a time of soaring inflation — Brisbane City Council wants to charge us for the privilege of shopping here.

This whopping 5.33% increase, effectively — from 9.375% to 9.875% — means we would be paying the highest rate of any shoppers in the county!

Our "public servants" claim it is needed for "pothole/street repair," "neighborhood patrols," and "fire prevention." If those services are a priority, why aren't they in the current budget?

Budgets illustrate an organization's priorities. When officials resort to funding services via voter-approved tax hikes, they indirectly admit that the proposed projects are LESS IMPORTANT than the projects identified in the current budget.
